## Paul's Fund

Paul's Fund is a charitable trust that makes grants to cover the cost of a much needed holiday break staying at "Paul's Place", which offers both B&B and self-catering accommodation near Croyde on the North Devon coast.

The focus of Paul's Fund is supporting young adults aged approximately 18 to 30 who are facing particularly challenging circumstances, namely:

- **Diagnosis of a terminal or life threatening illness**
- **Bereavement**
- **Being a long term, unpaid carer for a close relative.**

Parents who are caring for a terminally ill young adult son or daughter, or who have been bereaved through their loss, may also apply.

Paul's Fund will also pay for close family members or a friend accompanying the young adult.

Lucy Cooper stayed at Paul's Place with her mum and sister. Afterwards she wrote:

The break was exactly what we needed – a chance to spend time in a relaxed and beautiful place and to create positive memories together."*



## Paul's Story

Paul, the son of David and Pippa Morton and brother to Rebekah, was diagnosed with a brain tumour in February 2007 when he was in the 6th form at St Mary Redcliffe and Temple School in Bristol. Following surgery, he quickly resumed his studies, successfully passed his A levels and went to Leeds University in the autumn to study biochemistry.

There he threw himself into university life, particularly enjoying kayaking and the Christian Union. However, in February 2008 the tumour reappeared and he died peacefully at home in November aged 19.



Paul was in many ways an unassuming young man, but he loved the outdoors, was musical and had a gift for both painting and photography. His smile, sense of fun and concern for others touched all who knew him.

Paul was a committed Christian and was active in his home church, Pip 'n' Jay, and in the Christian Union in Leeds.

Throughout his illness, Paul demonstrated a quiet courage and determination to get on with his life, sustained by his faith in a loving God. His hallmark smile and sense of fun stayed with him to the end, and his inspiration to those around him are a part of his lasting legacy.

## Paul's Place

Paul's Place is located at The Old Bakery in the beautiful village of Georgeham near Croyde on the North Devon coast.

Paul's Place offers both B&B and self-catering accommodation and is run by David and Pippa Morton, Paul's parents. It is open to the general public trading as The Old Bakery but as Paul's Place the focus is very much on providing young adults, their family and friends, with a much needed break in a comfortable and caring environment. More than just accommodation for a holiday, Paul's Place aims to be somewhere special that will be a source of strength, hope and positive memories for all who come, whatever their circumstances.

In the main house there are three twin/double guest rooms, all ensuite, including one on the ground floor with an accessible shower. The kitchen is available to guests for their own use offering flexible self-catering options. In addition, The Garden Room is a separate fully self-catering cottage that sleeps two.

Georgeham is less than 2 miles from the beautiful Croyde, and Putsborough beaches. The local area has so much to offer whether you want to lose yourself in peace and solitude, or enjoy the buzz and activities of one of the UK's best stretches of coast line.
